GAME AND FISH COMMISSION—ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL BIG GAME TAGS

CHAPTER 90

HOUSE BILL 2064

AN ACT

RELATING TO GAME AND FISH; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND TRANSFER OF SPECIAL BIG GAME TAGS TO CERTAIN INCORPORATED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN NOTICE AND CERTAIN REPORT, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EXPIRATION DATE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
Section 1. Arizona game and fish commission;
special big game tags; notice; report

A. Separate from the regular big game drawing, the Arizona game and fish commission may issue special big game tags in the name of an incorporated nonprofit organization which is dedicated to wildlife conservation and does not engage in lobbying activities, except that the commission may issue no more than two special big game tags for each species of big game in a license year. Notwithstanding section 17-332, subsection D, Arizona Revised Statutes, the recipient organization of each special big game tag that the commission issues may sell and transfer the special big game tag if all proceeds of the sale and transfer are used in this state for purposes of wildlife management.

B. The Arizona game and fish commission shall notify the chairman of the senate natural resources and agriculture committee and the chairman of the house of representatives natural resources and energy committee in the same manner that it notifies the secretary of state as provided in section 41-1002, Arizona Revised Statutes, before the adoption, amendment

or repeal of a rule relating to a special big game tag.

C. The Arizona game and fish commission shall by January 1, 1985 prepare a report to the house of representatives natural resources and energy committee and the senate natural resources and agriculture committee concerning the costs of and monies raised pursuant to special big game tags authorized by this act.

Sec. 2. Expiration date

This act expires from and after December 31, 1986.
