The Forest Service began implementing the project in October 2015, and completed the thinning and piling of 652 acres in October 2016. The goal of the project was to remove encroaching Juniper and Ponderosa Pine from areas that were previously meadows and open grasslands.

ROJECT RESULT ACTIONS

The Forest Service's treatment will improve the herbaceous community since encroaching trees species from grassland sites were reduced/removed. This project will benefit habitat for pronghorn, elk and mule deer. It will also benefit many nongame grassland species of conservation concern such as golden eagles, various song birds and small mammals. Removed conifers will also benefit important browse species such as cliff rose which is important winter forage for antelope and deer.
