Dear Interested Party:

This letter initiates the scoping for the Pinto Creek Corral project on Tonto Basin Ranger District. The project is in Blevens pasture, near Forest Road 1491, approximately one mile south of Highway 188 and Spring Creek on the Poison Springs allotment. The legal location of the project is Township 3N, Range 13E, Section 2.

Existing Condition

The Poison Springs Allotment on the Tonto Basin Ranger District has been in non-use for several years. As livestock are moved back onto the allotment it became clear that additional infrastructure was needed in the Blevens Pasture to support the livestock operation. Within the Blevens Pasture limited livestock handling features are accessible and highway 188 prevents easy access and movement of livestock to other pastures. This pasture is in Management area 6J which manages for a variety of renewable natural resources with one of the primary emphasis on livestock forage production.

Desired Conditions

To provide adequate handling facilities on the allotment to manage livestock.

Current Management Direction

In management area 6J livestock should be managed at Level D. Level D management for livestock includes:

Management seeks to optimize production and utilization of forage allocated for livestock use consistent with maintaining the environment and providing the multiple use of the range. From all existing range and livestock management technology, practices may be selected and used to develop cost effective methods for achieving improved forage supplies and uniform livestock distribution and forage use... Cultural practices may be combined with fencing and water developments to implement complex grazing systems and management methods.

Purpose and Need

The purpose and need of the project is to provide adequate handling facilities to manage livestock that are on the allotment.



Proposed Action

A new corral that will be constructed around the Pinto Creek Well. The corral will be approximately 100' x 100' with a loading chute and a drift fence to help gather cows.

Design Features

- The Corral will be constructed of steel
- Forest Road 1491 cannot be blocked by the corral or the drift fence
- Forest Road 1491 will be authorized for maintenance by rancher

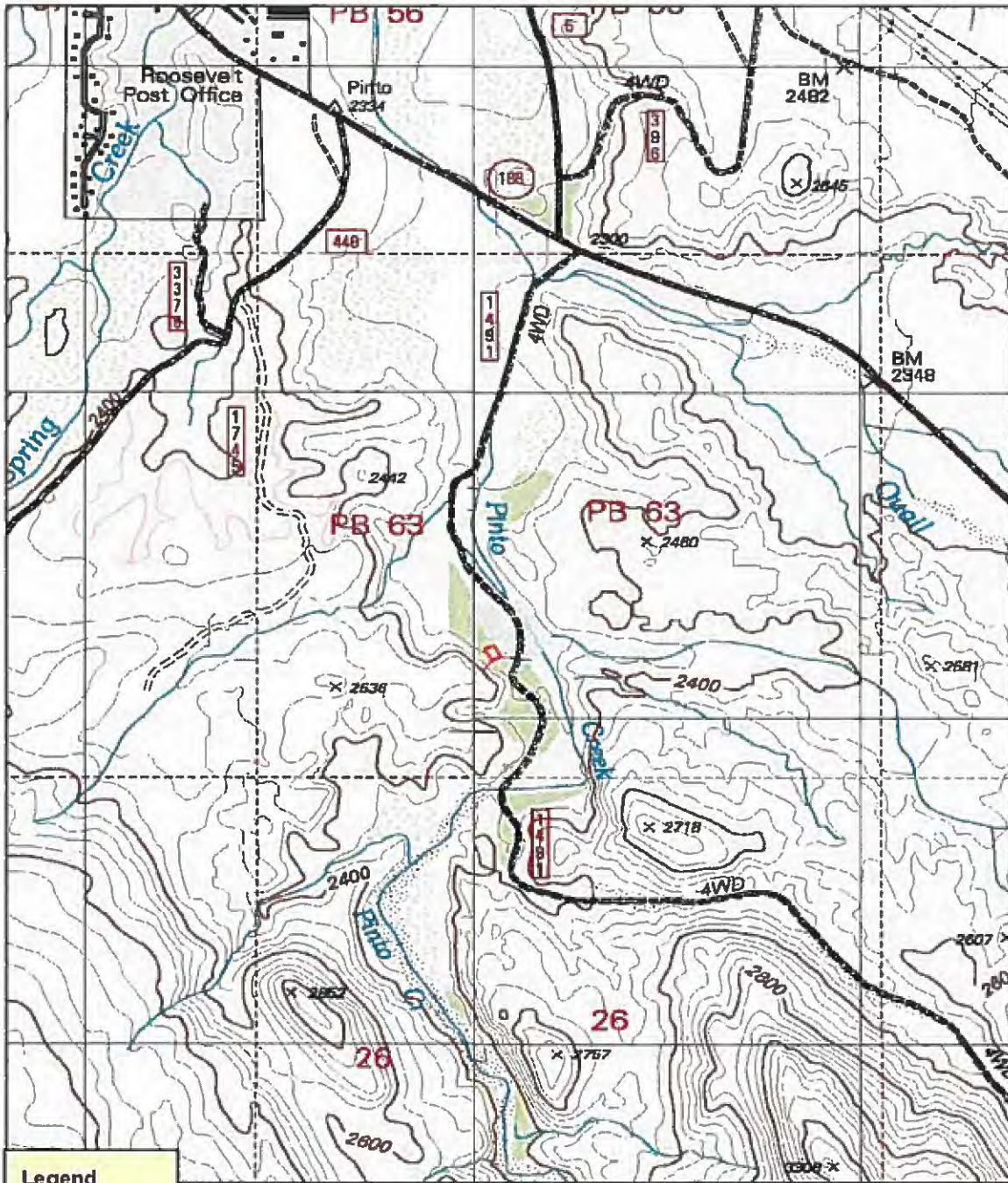
