Summarize Project Accomplishments: Through the fall of 2019, I organized the installation of a water pipeline at White Canyon to provide water to the Desert Bighorn Sheep. This rugged mesa region is ideal for a bighorn habitat. The region provided many challenges to successfully complete the project. The material was carefully planned with consideration of purpose and longevity as top priorities. Once selected, materials were slowly and carefully transported to the worksite over a period of a few weeks. Everything was staged and ready for installation prior to installation. Once all of the material was on-site, a large crew in excess of 30 people including Boy Scouts, family, and supporters were scheduled to help install the water system. The water system was installed entirely by hand over the course of two days. I would like to thank the ADBSS for their support of this important project. Through careful planning, engineering, and a great deal of support, this project should provide water to the Desert Bighorn Sheep and other wildlife for many years to come.
