
BRONCO ALLOTMENT Management Plan Cave Creek Ranger District Tonto National Forest



Basic Description

The allotment consists of six pastures equaling approximately 8,000 acres. There are 7,300 acres which are considered suitable for grazing use. The bulk of the capacity is derived from the combined Cave Creek, Cottonwood and North Bronco pastures. The Sugarloaf, Skull and Wildcat pastures are the smaller of the six but have district management implications that will be addressed in subsequent parts of this plan.

The operation is to be winter seasonal use for six months, November 15 -May 15 each year by 65 head of cattle. Registered Brangus cows and bulls are permitted with calving occurring on the Forest generally scheduled from February through April. Branding and tagging is scheduled to be done on private lands when the cattle are moved off the Forest in May. However, it is permissable to carry out these tasks on the Forest as well. Pasture moves will be made once each winter season of use. The system will be a simple two pasture-deferred rotation involving Sugarloaf, Skull and Cave Creek pastures as one unit and the Cottonwood and North Bronco pastures combined to form the other unit. Gathering in the North Bronco pasture can be accomplished in Jack's holding pasture or by driving cattle onto private land to the south. Gathering in the westside unit can be accomplished in the Cottonwood Spring water lot and corral and the Cave Creek corral on FR #48.

The Wildcat pasture is isolated from the rest of the Forest portion of the allotment due to private lands. It is accessible from the ten acre base of operations in the northeast of Section 21, T6N, R5E. It is an area of little forage value and poorly watered. Limited use will be allowed during the permitted season of 11/15-5/15 when cattle are moved on and off the base property at the beginning and ending of each season of use. Use will not exceed two days in this pasture at either end of the permitted grazing season 11/15-5/15.

Allowable use under this season and system of use is set at 40% of the current year's perennial herbaceous forage crop. Move date will be tentatively scheduled mid-season around February 15. Actual date of move will be based on observed average actual use of the forage in the pasture first grazed. The system is schedule to repeat itself once before reversing the use sequence.

Goals and Objective of Management

- 1. Develop the Bronco range resource to its reasonably attainable potential.
- Improve and maintain the environmental quality of the range by managing the grazing in harmony with the needs of other resources and their uses, and by exerting a favorable influence on associated private lands.

Management System

Two pasture-deferred rotation under a six month winter season of use (11/15-5/15) by 65 head of cows/bulls. Movement on and off Forest will be from private lands to the south of the Carefree Ranch properties. (See form 2200-18, Management Unit Allocation, for graphic outline of this system).

Distribution Aids to be Employed

Sufficient developed and naturally occurring waters exist in each pasture of this allotment to achieve uniform distribution and use. Existing trails aid in this regard also. Salting will be used and a plan will be annually revised in the permittee instructions to help even out the habitually preferred use zones. It will be placed on areas of good feed at least $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away from water and in areas needing encouragement for more use. Interior fencing exists to implement this plan, however, a $\frac{1}{2}$ mile proposed extension of one interior division fence will probably be needed.

Range Improvements - Construction

- 1. Allotment/Forest boundary fence 3 miles, FY 82-83.
- Cave Creek/Cottonwood Division fence extension ½ mile, FY 83.
- 3. Cave Creek cattle guard replacement, FY 81-82. Done.

No nonstructural improvements are scheduled.

Maintenance of Improvements

Follow-up Action

Annual inspection will be made in conjunction with entry to or removal from the Forest in the fall or spring of each year. Annual permittee instructions will be issued prior to entry in the fall and will contain the current year's salting plan, pasture use sequence, move date and program of range development maintenance to be done.

Range allotment analysis and production and use surveys are not scheduled until the mid to late 80's due to higher priorities existing elsewhere on the District at this time. An established pattern and system of use under a revised number and season of use will have been the "on-the-ground" situation from January 1, 1982 up to the time of scheduled analysis and survey. This is a desireable situation to have immediately preceeding survey.
