I. Permitted and Authorized Use

Permit is not validated until grazing fees are paid and livestock are turned onto the Forest in that order.

The end of the season as specified above is the date by which the specified number of livestock are to be removed from the allotment. As you know, it is not possible to gather and remove livestock in one or two days, and we encourage you to start moving livestock well in advance of the off date so that a violation of the permit will not occur.

By September 30 all cattle are to be removed from the Burro Allotment.

II. Grazing Schedule

III. Forage Utilization Standards

Forage utilization standards are set at 40% of the current years production in key areas (40% allowable use). Key areas are generally those that contain available forage within 1/4 to 1/2 mile from water. Each key area will be monitored at least once during the season.

IV. Permittee Management Responsibilities

1. Where any Forest or State closure exists or is enacted, Permittee will be responsible to be in compliance with all regulations of the closure.
2. The proper placement of salt is a valuable distribution aid. Place salt on the ridges and away from concentration areas as a tool for livestock to learn where good feed is located. Salt will also be removed from grazed areas to ungrazed areas as needed.

The placement of salt or supplement within pastures of the Burro allotment will not be located closer than 1/4 mile from water sources, fences, and other areas of livestock concentration, unless local topography interferes. Salt will not be placed within sight of roads, trails, and any area frequented by the public.

3. Permittee is responsible for ensuring that all water developments are in working condition and are ready to meet the needs of livestock management on the allotment. Any water development that is not in working condition should be identified and the process started to repair or replace it.

Water hauling is an option the permittee can use to lengthen the time in an area, assuming the allowable utilization level has not been reached.

4. Any cattle that die naturally or by accident should be removed as soon as possible and properly disposed of. If condors are present on the carcass, please leave it as is and contact the North Kaibab Ranger District as soon as possible.

V. Improvement Maintenance

All improvements within each pasture and fences between pastures are to be maintained and operational prior to the entry date for that pasture. Improvement maintenance standards can be found on pages 10-26 of your Term Grazing Permit. Improvements are to be maintained during years of partial or total non-use; improvements within any rested pastures are to be maintained.
