Proposed Action/Type: Approval of transfers of grazing preference.

Proposed Action: The proposed action is to transfer the grazing preference on the C-Spear Ranch Allotment No. 44090, a section 15 grazing lease from Mrs. Hope Jones to C-Spear LLC. The C-Spear Ranch Allotment is currently an active allotment, and would be issued a lease for a period of ten years under the authority of Section 402(c)(2) of FLPMA, 1976 as amended. This lease would contain the same mandatory terms and conditions as the previous lease (see Terms below).

The allotment is located 32 miles northwest of Willcox, AZ, primarily in Cochise County with a small portion in Graham County, in T 12S, R 20E all of sections 18, 17,16,8,7,6, and 5. SW ¼ of Sec. 9 and all but the SE ¼ of section 19. The allotment is also located in T 11S, R 20E all of sections 32 and 31, S ½ of sec 29, E ½ SE ¼ of sec 30 and T 11S 19E SE ¼ and SE ¼ SW ¼ . The allotment is comprised of 440 acres of BLM-administered public land, 4,487 acres of State Land, and 1,052 acres of Private Land (see attached map).


