Dear Permittee:

On May 21, 2021, Kendell and Andy met with [REDACTED] to discuss the 2021 Annual Operating Instructions (AOI) for the Chevelon Canyon and Wallace Allotments. The allotments will be run separately with two herds. The numbers and rotation authorized and agreed upon are as follows:

<u>Allotment</u>	<u>Pasture</u>	<u>Numbers</u>	<u>Dates</u>
Chevelon Canyon	Sandpoint	109 cow/calf	June 1 to June 30
Chevelon Canyon	Breed	109 cow/calf	July 1 to July 31
Chevelon Canyon	Circle Bar	109 cow/calf	August 1 to September 30
Wallace	Waters	200 cow/calf	June 1 to July 31
Wallace	Grama	200 cow/calf	August 1 to September 30

The desired utilization level for the 2021 grazing season will be an average of 25% on grasses and herbaceous species and an average of 40% of terminal ends on shrubs and browse species. Adjustments to this rotation may be needed during the grazing season to accommodate to changing conditions. You must notify the Forest Service at least one week in advance of a change in rotation. When moving between pastures, the entire pasture must be cleaned within 3 days of the scheduled move date.

On the Chevelon Canyon Allotment, you are authorized to keep 3 horses in the Nagel Holding Pasture for use on the allotment. On the Wallace Allotment, you are authorized to keep 5 horses in the Wallace Holding Pasture or the Forest Service Holding Pasture just north of the work center for use on the allotment. You may also use the Babbitt Holding Pasture on the Chevelon Canyon Allotment for horses also. If use exceeds 25% in any one of the holding pastures, you will be asked to remove the horses from the Forest.

By this letter, I also authorize you or ranch personnel working for you to cut, use, or remove any trees needed for fence posts and stays for maintenance of structural range improvements within the Chevelon Canyon and Wallace Allotments. A copy of this letter must be in possession by you or them while engaged in any tree cutting.



Any new projects must be reviewed with the Forest Service and all clearances must be obtained before beginning the new project. This letter will serve as your Annual Operating Instructions for the 2021 grazing season on the Chevelon Canyon and Wallace Allotments. I am willing to meet with you to hear and discuss any concerns or issues related to these Annual Operating Instructions.
