Project Description: This project will increase water storage, and remove some of the softer sediments in Fix, Dave's, NE, Rock and Everett tanks on the Ebert and Smoot Lake Allotments and will help prevent wildlife from becoming caught in the tank bottoms as they dry up. The availability of dependable water will also help to more evenly distribute the elk population as well as other large ungulate species.			
This is a joint project between the Kaibab National Forest (KNF) and the Arizona Game and Fish Department who are working in cooperation to benefit wildlife habitat. Mike Hannaman with the KNF has cleared all five tanks for renovation and has determined that no NEPA clearances are required and has completed the required archaeological evaluations. The KNF has agreed to supply the front end loader and has agreed to do the work on the proposed five tanks under a collection agreement. This project was also coordinated with Steve Clark, President of the Arizona Elk Society.

NEED STATEMENT/PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

In July of 2010 more than fifteen elk calves became stuck in mud at Fix, Dave's and NE tanks in northern unit 7W as these tanks went dry prior to monsoon rains. Only six elk calves were saved.

Fix, Dave's, NE, Rock and Ebert tanks are within year-round range of elk, antelope and to a lesser extent mule deer. There were several large elk herds in the area prior to these tanks going dry. Over the years these tanks have accumulated a heavy silt load decreasing the amount of water available to wildlife and increasing the likelihood of wildlife becoming trapped while trying to water.

Renovating and cleaning these stock tanks will increase water storage capacity and reliable water in the area for wildlife while minimizing the entrapment risk to antelope and deer fawns and elk calves.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- 1) Increase available water to wildlife in these 5 dirt tanks
- 2) Decrease entrapment risk to wildlife by removal of accumulated sediment load from the tanks
- 3) Decrease water hauling expenses

PROJECT STRATEGIES:

The Kaibab National Forest will utilize their front-end loader to renovate these five dirt tanks. Work will begin as soon as funding is secure and the dirt tanks are dry again (all 5 have collected water from 2010 summer monsoons).

PROJECT LOCATION:

The five dirt tanks located are located in the north-east part of the Williams Ranger District on the Kaibab National Forest.

ITEMIZED USE OF FUNDS:

Cost is difficult to estimate at this time as all five of these tanks collected monsoon runoff. Depending on the amount of sediment load in each tank the estimated cost is a minimum of \$2,500/tank to a maximum of \$5,000/tank. We are seeking the maximum estimated cost to insure sufficient funds are available to complete this project. If costs are lower, any leftover money will be returned to the SBG Funds.

The Kaibab National Forest has completed the archaeological clearances for the five tanks at an estimated cost of \$1,000.


