NEED STATEMENT – PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

Water in this area is the limiting factor for Wildlife (Turkey, Deer & Bear) during the summer months. Water will be available for wildlife yearlong; this project will provide a permanent water improvement in High Creek Canyon for wildlife.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES: Improve quality and quantity of wildlife habitat for Turkey, Whitetail Deer, and Bear through improving water distribution and availability.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES: Install a 5,000 gallon Storage Tank and trough to an existing pipeline that runs from High Peak Spring to State and Private land. This project is part of an ongoing landscape application that would provide a permanent water development place approximately every mile along the east side of the Galiuro Mountain Range to improve the habitat for Turkey and Deer. South Ash Canyon, North Ash Canyon, & Oak Canyon permanent water has been developed with HPC's help.
