NEED STATEMENT - PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

This area consists of excellent habitat for Coues whitetail deer and javelina, but it is very dry and lacks natural perennial water sources. Drought has caused a perennial spring in the area to go dry. There are very few year round water sources available in this part of the Canelo Hills and in Red Rock Canyon proper. This pipeline provides a source of permanent, year-long water to the Moonshine Pasture on the Coronado National Forest.

Winter helicopter surveys routinely count 15-25 deer and 20-25 javelina in the immediate vicinity of the project location.

An old US Forest Service water catchment use to provide water to this area. However, the apron broke apart and it no longer collects water. There is a functional 10,000 gallon water storage tank and trough (see picture below) at this site. The US Forest Service will allow the use of these materials for the project.



Access into the area is available. Access is gained through the Byrum Ranch. An AZGFD sign in box is located at the Ranch headquarters and hunters can cross the private property onto US Forest Service land just by signing in.

Addition of this water source will also allow the Byrum Ranch more options of rotating cattle pastures and will help keep cattle out of the riparian bottoms.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

Provide permanent water to the west end of Red Rock Canyon, Corral Canyon, and Moonshine Pasture while utilizing materials already on the ground.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES:

The Byrum Ranch will make minor repairs and modifications to the trough and storage tank. They will then construct a pipeline from an already functional drinker approximately 0.65 miles away to the storage tank. Water will be pumped to the storage tank and the trough will be kept full yearlong. USFS will perform required biological and archeological clearances. Wildlife Manger Matt Braun will complete the AZGFD EA Checklist.





HABITAT DESCRIPTION:

The habitat type is typically referreed to as Madrean Oak Woodlands, comprised primarily of various oak species (*Quercus sp.*), Juniper (*Juniperus sp.*), pinion (*Pinus sp.*), manzanita (*Arctostaphylos sp.*), cliffrose (*Cowania mexicana*).), yuccas (*Yucca sp.*), False Mesquite (*Calliandra eriophylla*), prickly pear cactus (*Opuntia sp.*), various native grasses and forbs. The area ranges from 4500-5000 foot elevation with a number of drainages and riparian areas cutting through the hills. These drainages consist of a variety of riparian species, including cottonwood (*Populus sp.*), Arizona walnut (*Juglans major*), and willow (*Salix sp.*).
