NEED STATEMENT – PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

The Red lake allotment is a very popular elk and deer hunting portion of Northern Unit 23. As like many areas within Arizona water has always been a limiting factor for big game populations. Currently, within this allotment the Naeglin Mountain, Red Lake and Parallel Canyon area are limited to perennial water along Cherry Creek, a few dirt tanks/springs, and other intermittent drainages during wet years. This is a concern during poor spring and monsoon seasons especially with elk and deer relying on perennial waters within this portion of Unit 23. By building these dirt tanks in key areas, water would be available year-round within important big game habitat.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

Provide wildlife water for both game and non-game species within the Naeglin Mountain, South of Parallel Canyon, and Red Lake areas.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES:



This strategy for this proposal is to provide funding to the permitee to rent a dozer, a trailer to haul it, and purchase diesel fuel to build 7 new dirt tanks in Naeglin Mountain, south of Parallel Canyon, and Red lake area. The owner of the Red Lake Ranch will facilitate the rental of the dozer, the purchasing of the fuel, and provide labor. Arizona Game and Fish Department will coordinate with the permitee and provide assistance as needed.

This project is undergoing the NEPA process and will not be completed before the September 1 deadline, but will be completed before the implementation of these tanks.
