Brief Project Summary: This is an ongoing program within the Landowner Relations Program that provides funding to ranchers that contain a significant amount of winter forage used by elk. This program is designed to alleviate some of the pressure some pastures may receive from wintering herds of elk. The program provides ranchers with either seed, fertilizer, salt blocks, and elk jumps to be used in pastures used by elk as winter forage habitat. In return, the rancher agrees to allow elk to use the pastures and the improve elk habitat. \$50,000 will be planned to use in this elk stewardship effort, with an additional \$12,000 to be used for fuel and maintenance for critical elk waters.

NEED STATEMENT – PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

This project will address the condition of winter forage habitat available to elk in the northeast portion of the state, and alleviate landowner concerns related to elk use. The winter forage habitat available to elk herds is vital to ensuring elk populations remain healthy and stable. This program addresses this issue by partnering with landowners to improve available winter forage habitat by providing fertilizer and seed to landowners to use to manage pastures to maintain high quality winter forage for elk. In addition, money will be provided to fund fuel and maintenance costs of critical elk waters. The Department staff will rank the applicants, and funds are allocated based on how individual proposals scored.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

-To improve quality winter forage for elk and provide funding for fuel and maintenance costs of critical elk waters in Regions 1 and 6

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES:

-Through a stewardship agreement, partner with landowners containing winter forage habitat to improve this habitat for elk.

-Habitat will be improved using fertilizer to increase production of forage or seed to plant new forage habitat.

-Landowners will plant seed or fertilize pastures used by wintering elk herds, and together this program will provide high quality winter forage habitat for elk.

-Landowners will use salt blocks and elk jumps to alleviate elk use

-Funding will be provided for fuel and maintenance costs of critical elk waters
