Dear Permittee:

On February 06, 2019, Kendell and Andy met with you to discuss the 2019 Annual Operating Instructions (AOI) for the Park Day Allotment. The pasture rotation and numbers agreed upon are as follows:

<u>Pasture</u>	<u>Head</u>	<u>Dates</u>
East Scott	120 cow/calf	March 1 to March 30
Lower Day	120 cow/calf	March 31 to May 25
Lower Reidhead	120 cow/calf	May 26 to July 27
Upper Day	120 cow/calf	July 28 to September 17
Upper Reidhead	120 cow/calf	September 18 to October 12
Windmill	120 cow/calf	October 13 to December 21
Sheeptrail	120 cow/calf	December 22 to January 4
West Scott	120 cow/calf	January 5 to February 28

The Park and Corner Pastures will be rested this year. Utilization standards for the 2019 grazing season should not exceed an average of 35% during the growing season and 45% during dormant season on grasses. Use on browse and riparian tree/shrub species will not exceed 45% of the current year's growth. Adjustments to this rotation may be needed during the grazing season. Any adjustments to the rotation need to be coordinated and approved by the Forest Service. When moving between pastures, livestock need to be completely moved out of the pasture within 3 days of the planned rotation date. You must notify the Forest Service if there is a need to deviate from the planned move date. By this letter, I also authorize you or people working for you to cut, use or remove any trees needed for fence posts and stays for maintenance of structural range improvements within the Park Day Allotment. A copy of this letter must be in possession with you or them while engaged in any tree cutting.

Any range improvement projects and ground disturbing activities need to be coordinated with the Forest Service to make sure all clearances have been obtained before any work can begin on the ground.

This letter will serve as your Annual Operating Instructions for the 2019 grazing year.
