Re: Mexican wolf recovery being hampered by faulty investigations

Dear Secretary Haaland, Secretary Vilsack, Director Williams, and Regional Director Lueders,

The undersigned conservation organizations and individuals are deeply concerned with the findings reported in a recent *The Intercept* article, "Cry Wolf: Endangered Mexican wolf recovery is being 'sabotaged' by ranchers who claim the canines are killing cattle – and the federal employees who sign off on reports." (Published online May 24, 2022: <u>https://theintercept.com/2022/05/24/mexican-gray-wolf-endangered-wildlife-services-fraud/</u>. The article confirms many of our worst suspicions about Wildlife Services' role in Mexican gray wolf management, and underscores the problem of allowing the U.S. Department of Agriculture – an agency with an agenda of serving agricultural interests – to have any role in the Mexican wolf recovery program.

We are asking for immediate action to remedy this pervasive problem with the recovery project. The evidence that Western Watersheds Project has gathered, and that the *The Intercept* has now exposed, demonstrates the need for:

- The use of rigorous scientific methods in determinations as to the culpability of wolves in livestock deaths;
- The use of trained wolf biologists as secondary reviewers to serve as an unbiased backstop against fraud or negligence;

- A policy against using third party determinations, i.e. county wolf investigators, in any federal investigations;
- A review of depredation investigations since Mexican gray wolves were released into the wild in 1998 and a report on how these investigations have resulted in the removal of wolves from the wild;
- The release of any captive wolves who were unjustly implicated in depredation events;
- An inquiry by the Federal Bureau of Investigations and the Department of Justice into the extent of illegal activities among the employees of Wildlife Services and project cooperators in Arizona and New Mexico; and
- An immediate suspension of any depredation-related Mexican gray wolf removals.

The American public deserves answers about the extent to which these questionable investigations led to the lethal removal or permanent captivity of imperiled Mexican gray wolves, and the wolves themselves deserve to be returned to the wild.

We look forward to hearing of your plans to remedy these injustices.
